Foundations is the starting point in your Pioneer Leadership Training. You will explore the big picture of GB while practising how to plan and lead aspects of a company night.



After: 3 mentoring sessions and run and activity with cadets or juniors.



Community explores what it means to be part of a community, how people in the past have made a positive impact on their community and what God might be calling us to do.

After: present experience and learning from the module to her company.



Events explores the power of an event to make a positive impact on people's lives, while also learning the essential skills to take an event from idea to implementation.

After: run event planned at training



Team helps you to better understand how to effectively lead a team, while also considering the different support roles we can play as our team strive to reach a goal.

After: be an active participant at a meeting



Lead explores what it means to be a good leader and how your unique abilities can shape the kind of leader you are.

After: no activity



Deep is the final course and allows you to reflect and celebrate the person God has designed you to be. You will consider what it means to worship God, how God has crafted you and how you might lead others in exploring faith.
